Report on Frank and Lynn's Visit to Tanzania in January

This was a very successful trip for several reasons:

1. We added 7 new children to our program which brings our total now to 47! Please take some time to visit the website (www. abcdreams.ca) to read their stories and see their

artwork. If you have any friends, neighbours or family members who might be interested in supporting the education of one of our new children, please put them in touch with us.

2. We held our first and very festive ART DAY when all 47 of the children and many of their caregivers attended for art-making, lunch, and a special Awards Ceremony for children who had done well in school last year! The children also picked up their bags full of school supplies. We had well over 100 in attendance and it was wonderful to see the children all dressed in their Sunday clothes. Seven of our secondary school children received electronic calculators as awards for improvement in school and 10 of our primary school children received dictionaries for their improvement.

3. We attended a meeting with the village leaders Ward Association and are working with them to form a local ABCD Advisory Group. This group can one day assist us in monitoring the children's progress between our visits to Tanzania. The goal is that the local community can support and continue the good work of ABCD.

4. We entered into discussions with Kisuluni P.S. to institute a Breakfast Program for all of the children (220) at this school. This is in response to hearing from school officials that children arrive at school with no breakfast and that this is hindering their academic progress.

We are very proud and happy to report that our application to Canada Revenue Agency has been approved and that ABCD: Art Building Children's Dreams is now a fully registered Canadian charity! We can now issue tax receipts for donations and are working on our receipting procedures. We can also now approach Foundations, Corporations and Businesses for further support for our children. This marks the turning of a new page in the growth of our organization and augurs well for our capacity to further help the children.

We are so happy to share with you some of the wonderful success stories which have come about in the 3 years since you have been supporting the children through your donations to ABCD: Art Building Children's Dreams. We see these positive changes in our contact with the children every year and now we are receiving documented evidence from teachers, parents and the children themselves that your connection with them is having a truly beneficial effect on their well being and education.

Here are a few examples:

Abeli

Last year in 2009 Abeli stood at 14 out of 49 pupils in his class! His highest marks were in Science, History and Kiswahili (Swahili language), and Sports. Abeli's teacher reports that he is polite and cooperative. This is a quote from his teacher: "comparing with the previous days e.g. 2008, he is free and happy to share ideas with other students in the class. Also his attendance now is good"

Honest Peter

Honest Peter is attending Uomboni Secondary School and is now in Form 3. Last year his highest marks were 73% in Physics and 61% in Chemistry. His teacher reports "he is making tremendous progress in class. His attendance is also very good". Honest Peter's English is improving greatly and he was very helpful to us with translation during interviews at our 2010 Art Day.

Hyasinta

Hyasinta is now attending Lombeta Secondary School in Form 1 after doing well in her last year of primary school. Her report is good, with a B's in Science, Swahili Language and General Knowledge. Her teacher reports that she is improving and that she loves Art. Hyasinta was thrilled to be awarded a scientific calculator at our first Art Day Awards Ceremony for her improvement in school.

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In addition we accomplished our other necessary work: visiting the children at their schools and meeting with school officials, visiting the children and their caregivers at their homes, purchasing school supplies, school uniforms and personal care items for the children and of course paying at banks for school fees. In the 30 degree plus heat, all the hiking was exhausting but very rewarding work, and we are very happy to report the many of the children look healthier, happier and are achieving better results in school.



Bringing Light to Our Children by Lynn Bird

Over the past two years we have been considering the current state of lighting in the homes of our children. The children cannot do homework or extra studying because they don't have lighting. For most there is no lighting and for some there is a limited amount of light from a small kerosene burner. The burning of kerosene is a health and safety concern for our children and the kerosene is an additional expense to the family.

The cost of solar lighting components is coming down and with the strength of our Canadian dollar; a solar installation project looks very possible. ABCD has made a connection to a company which has developed the hardware to allow a school, or an individual (which could be one of our graduating students) to charge single lamps, a set of lamps and cell phones, for a fee. This could allow for lamps to charge during the day at school for example, and then be sent home with students in the evening. For perhaps less than \$1500 we can offer one of our graduating children a business opportunity in the form of a micro-credit loan to start up a solar charging service in his/her village.
